Holy Day of Obligation "Father, I understand going to Mass on Sunday, but I don't get it with Holy Day of Obligation."

The sanctification of the seventh day as a day or rest and worship is well known from Biblical times, as referenced in the creation story of Genesis. Also, for Christians, the transition from the seventh day to the first day of the week is well known as incarnated in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. As part of the Ten Commandments, God specifically commands in the third that "Remember the sabbath day-keep it holy. Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath of the Lord our God. You shall not do any work" (EX 20:8-10). The Sabbath day, therefore, becomes a day of the "Lord, holy and set apart for the praise of God, his work of creation, and his saving actions on behalf of Israel" (Catechism of the Catholic Church CCC 2171).

However, the Lord's Day metamorphosed into the day of resurrection, the new creation. The CCC states how this came about: "Jesus rose from the dead "on the first day of the week." Because it is the first day, the day of Christ's Resurrection recalls the first creation ushered in by Christ's Resurrection. For Christians, it has become the first of all days, the first of all feasts, the Lord's Day-Sunday (2174). Sunday, therefore, becomes a fulfillment of the sabbath and effectively replaces it (CCC 2177).

The perfect worship of God and observance of the day of the Lord is the celebration of the Eucharist, the sacrifice of the Son of God to God, and the sacrifice of the Mass. And so, the CCC states that "The Sunday Celebration of the Lord's Day and his Eucharist is at the heart of the Church's life. Sunday is the day on which the paschal mystery is celebrated in light of the Apostolic tradition and is to be observed as the foremost holy day of obligation in the universal church.

The CCC, highlighting the church's precepts, reemphasizes the provision of cannon Law that "on Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass." (CCC2180);cf. 1247) Consequently, it continues, "the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation unless excused for serious reason [and] Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin." (CCC 2181)

Now, it is established that Sunday is the "foremost holy day of obligation"; we turn our attention to other holy days of obligation. The CCC enumerates other days of obligation with the same force as the obligation of Sunday. It states, "Also to be observed are the day of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Epiphany, the Ascension of Christ, the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, the feast of Mary the Mother of God, her Immaculate Conception, her Assumption, the feast of Saint Joseph, the feast of the Apostles Peter and Paul, the Feast of
