# **Discipleship**

Providing students the opportunity to receive a faith-based, high-quality education through enrollment in one of our 12 Catholic schools is one of many ways to form lifelong disciples of Christ. Welcome Scholarships, introduced last year and partially funded by the annual appeal, resulted in a nearly 8 percent increase in overall students in our Catholic schools.

These scholarships, available for kindergarten through 11th grade students, will continue with contributions to Christ's Mission Appeal and individual funding.

The Diocese also is blessed to have a broad team of volunteers who educate and guide children and adults through religious education. With more than 4,400 people preparing to receive sacraments annually and hundreds of others attending programs and workshops geared to deepen their faith, support is vital.

In addition, nearly 380 trained lay ministers assist in a variety of roles in nearly every parish in the Diocese. These lay ministers complete a four-year program of practical, spiritual and theological training in preparation to assist parish leadership.

## **Evangelization**

The Diocese of Saginaw is blessed to have young men in formation for the priesthood. Donations to Christ's Mission Appeal support seminarians' tuition, housing and medical coverage.

Additionally, donations for the appeal help support vocation education for young people to learn about the priesthood and religious life, and those who work directly with those discerning a vocation.

The appeal also helps to fund events where youth can explore and expand their faith in upbeat and contemporary ways, such as our Witness event for young people.

# **Spreading the Good News**

By offering sacred encounters through many forms of digital and print media, we are able to further share the evangelizing mission of Jesus Christ.

Nearly 30,000 households throughout our 11 counties receive FAITH Saginaw magazine, which features inspiring faith stories about people living in our communities. We've increased the number of issues from four to six in the last year.

We share information each week with more than 9,000 email subscribers and welcome an average of 15,373 monthly users to our website in an effort to provide resources to help our people practice their faith. Many of our website visitors connect with local parishes through our website, as well.

We live stream Sunday Mass from the Cathedral of Mary of the Assumption for all who are unable to attend in person (more details below). We also live stream daily Mass via our website, www.saginaw.org, social media and closed circuit television at Ascension St. Mary's hospital.

Although we have regularly live streamed Masses from the Cathedral


